### What to Know

- Pack provides & pays for main menu, feel free to augment with your own special food
- Pack provides dishwashing line...minimize paper, bring camping utensils & plates
- Bring your own ice chest with your own special drinks (other than H2O & menu drinks)
- No alcohol, tobacco or weapons of any kind, please (B.S.A. official policy)
- Adults in tents with kids must be parent of any/all kids in tent (B.S.A. official policy)
- Walkie Talkies should be set to Channel 3, SubChannel 4 (get it? Pack 34!)
- Leave video games, portable TVs, boom-boxes, hairspray, dental floss etc. at home
- Please do not bring PEANUTS or products with PEANUT OIL or PEANUT FLOUR.  
(We have one scout that has a severe Peanut allergy. Thank you!)
- Always park backwards at Tamarancho, for quick exit in case of fire.

### What to Bring

- food utensils, cups & plates for your party (mark 'em with a Sharpie or similar marker)
- personal items incl. toothpaste/toothbrush, washcloth, soap, towel
- tent, groundcloth, sleeping pads, sleeping bags for your party
- flashlight & lantern (we'll bring a bunch of lanterns)
- hat, sunblock, insect repellent
- personal clothing...warm days, cold (possibly cold, windy & misty!) nights
- swimsuit, fishing gear (there are bass in that lake, it's a fact!)
- binoculars, telescope (also optional)
- mountain bikes, helmets (note: for single-track trails, may be restricted on camp roads)
- musical instruments, in case you'd like to strum up a tune for the Pack
- firewood and block ice to donate, spare bags of charcoal
- group equipment incl. Lanterns, Stoves, Pots, Griddles etc....if you've been contacted directly by Quartermasters Dave & Duncan

**Camp Tamarancho: 1000 Iron Springs Road, Fairfax, CA, (415) 459-9530**

- From US highway 101N, take the Central San Rafael exit.
- Turn west on 3rd street, and travel 1.5 miles.
- 3rd street merges into 4th street, and then into Red Hill Avenue.
- Continue on Red Hill for another 0.7 miles.
- Red Hill Ave merges into Sir Francis Drake Blvd, follow 2.2 miles.
- Turn left onto Olema Rd. Travel 0.1 miles.
- Turn left on Manor. Travel 50 yards.
- Turn right on Rockridge. Travel 0.1 miles.
- Turn left on Iron Springs Road.
- Camp Tamarancho is at the end of Iron Springs Rd, about 2.0 mi.

Check with Ranger Phil near the Mess Hall when you show up. We're in Ghilotti Family Campground, just to the right of the main entrance as you're driving in. You'll blow right past the camp as you head for the Mess Hall, and need to backtrack a few 100 yards after you visit Ranger Phil. Then, the turn will be on your left side...same place as '04 Family Fiesta. Dave Lundgren's blue VW Camper will be prominently deployed prior to first campers. Should be ample parking for all, right at the site...
