What do you do in Cub Scouts?

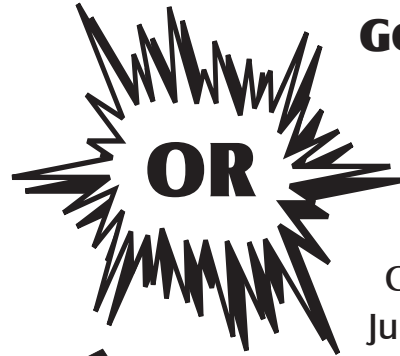
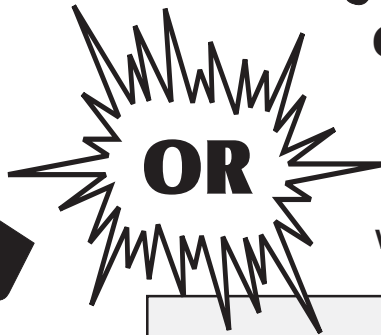

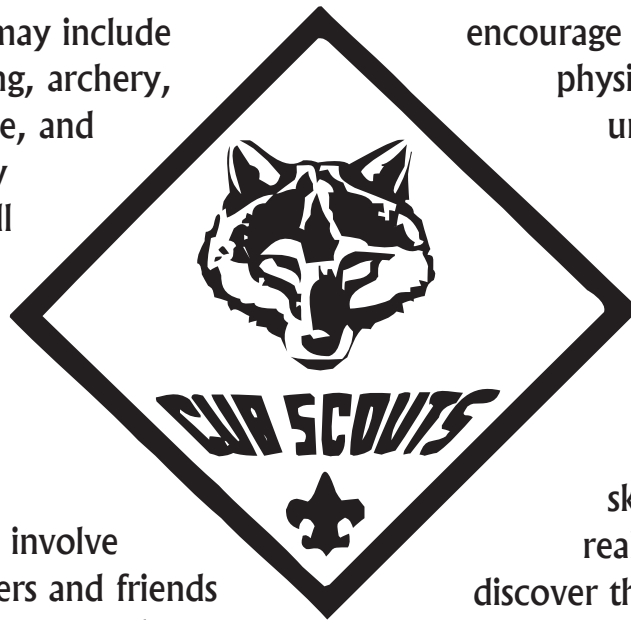
A Message for Parents
