- flashlight & lantern (if you have lantern, we'll bring a bunch)

**Camp Tamarancho Address:  
1000 Iron Springs Road, Fairfax, CA

- From US highway 101N, take the Central San Rafael exit.
- Turn west on 3rd street, and travel 1.5 miles.
- 3rd street merges into 4th street, and then into Red Hill Avenue.
- Continue on Red Hill for another 0.7 miles.
- Red Hill Ave merges into Sir Francis Drake Blvd. Follow SFD for another 2.2 miles. (The map below covers the western end of the Sir Francis Drake route and the turns from SFD to Iron Springs Road).
- Turn left onto Olema Rd. Travel 0.1 miles.
- Turn left on Manor. Travel 50 yards.
- Turn right on Rockridge. Travel 0.1 miles.
- Turn left on Iron Springs Road.
- Camp Tamarancho is at the end of Iron Springs Rd, about 2.0 miles.  
Check in with Ranger Phil and/or the Mess Hall when you show up. We're in Twin Cities Campground, about 300 yards beyond the Mess Hall and Ranger Phil's office, up and over 2 "hump" hills. Camp is on the right side, Dave Lundgren's blue VW pop-top camper will be prominently deployed prior to first arriving camper. You can park up there, or worst case if you're late, drop your stuff off then shuttle back to the main parking lot.
